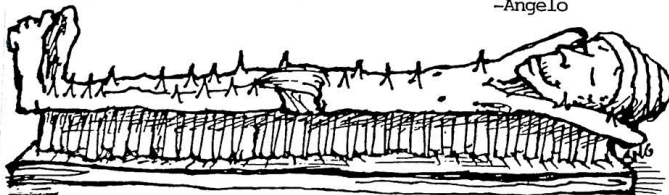

interview!

In the last issue you might have noticed a record review where I couldn't really review it, because the music was so original. Well, after that I wanted to find out, more about this band CHUMBAWAMBA, I made a few phone calls, and when one of the members, "Boff" came to the U.S. we canned a quick interview. -chicken

SP: "You're going to have to work with me on this one."

Boff: (laughter) "You just give me one question, and I'll talk for like..."

SP: "What I want to know is, where did the name CHUMBAWABA come from?"

Boff: "It's umm, well a long time ago...do you know what basking is? (I nod no) It's playing in the streets for money, putting a hat down, you know, we did that in Paris, a couple of month one year, and doing like CLASH songs and we met these people who also were basking, and they chanted CHUMBAWAMBA over and over again. Some sort of African band..."

SP: How many of you were in the band then?"

Boff: Just three, me Danbert, and Mitch. Mitch isn't in the band any longer, we were terrible."

SP: "Anarchy was your fourth full length?"

Boff: "No, more, were about our seventh or eighth. We did stuff under different names. We did a double album under the name SPORTCASTRE (i think that's

what he said,) and it was called, '101 Songs About Sport', all really fast. And we have a couple albums, which are out of print, but we're re-releasing them."

SP: "So, you've been together for ten years."

Boff: "No, actually more, but we have been recording for ten."

SP: "You guys don't have side jobs, do you?"

Boff: "No, not any more, about two years ago we decided to do the band full time, but now we do tours all the time. With the side jobs, we could only play weekends."

SP: "Would you sign to a major label, if you were approached?"

Boff: "In Britain, we wouldn't, cause we don't need to, and we don't want to, we reach Europe quite well. We are signed to a major distributor, but that was a big mess, where the independent label sold the distribution to a major, and we didn't have much choice. I'm not saying we wouldn't have done it, but we didn't have a choice."

SP: "Well, I mean would you sign, say to Warner Bros. if they gave you intl. coverage, a promise for two videos on Mtv..."

Boff: "We'd think about it, but probably not. But I feel that Warner Bros. is a pile of shit. And they wouldn't let us have control, were control freaks."

SP: "Your latest LP, 'Anarchy', when looking at the name, I wondered are all eight in the group, anarchists, and did you specifically look for them?"

Boff: "Yes, we are all anarchists, it just happened. There were two or three of us who got involved in politics in the eighties, because of Margaret Thatcher, and we had to, also because of punk, and because of CRASS, and the SEX PISTOLS, and bands like that, and we just stumbled into people, then we said, by the way, can you play an instrument, that's how it works."

SP: "What I find strange, or what most people would find strange is, that your album is called Anarchy, and it doesn't sound like CRASS, it almost had at sometimes a disco beat."

Boff: "Yeah, were really into the idea of Anarchy being ummm...cause since we were into that CRASS sound, we made records like that, but we are 10 years older now, we went through so many different stages, the difference between Anarchy and Marxism is that it accepts change. Culture changes."

SP: "I wouldn't call your music punk, but it does have that punk feel to it."
Boff: "It's not what people would call punk music, Maximum Rock and Roll won't review our records."

SP: "They won't? They did an interview with you."

Boff: "yeah, quite a while ago, about a year after that they decided... after we did the album 'Shhh' that we weren't punk and they didn't want our records anymore."

SP: "How has the feedback been, towards the whole band?"

Boff: "Yeah, really positive."

SP: "Have you gotten any negative?"

Boff: "Oh, yeah, we get some negative, from the people who knew us when we were tiny, when we just used to do cassettes and things, they say 'Sellout', and things like that."

SP: "Do you, honestly, think that you are a sellout?"

Boff: "No, not really. Out of all the bands that were around when we started, we are the only ones who are still around."

SP: "Who did you play with back then?"

Boff: "The whole CRASS thing.."

SP: "You played with CRASS?"

Boff: "No, but we knew them, we played with CONFLICT, loads of times, well the SUBHUMANS are still around as CITIZEN FISH, but we played with those guys, and all the bands on the CRASS label."

SP: "When you tour the U.S. do you play all clubs, or just under 21?"

Boff: "Our last tour, we did that, and only played all ages shows, and many clubs wouldn't book us."

SP: "I think it sucks, being under 21, because the DICKIES just played at a bar around here. The bar and band could both make more money if they did two shows, an over 21, and an all ages. I know ALL did that a few years ago."

Boff: "There's no reason for the DICKIES to do that, because they do have the money, and their american, but there will always be people who will say, 'Oh god, there's kids here.' We lost 5,000 pounds by just playing all ages shows in about six weeks, and it totally wiped us out for about a year, but at the end we thought it was really cool that we did that."

BOUNCING SOULS

Angelo bagged this interview with Greg, (vocals) from BOUNCING SOULS at a recent show with JFA, and others... check it out.

SP: "First Off, how did you get the deal with BYO?"

SOUL: "Ahh, that's a funny one. We were on tour this summer for a few weeks, and we played with them in Jersey in the Spring of 94', they played real early, so they didn't see us, but we saw them, and that was really cool."

SP: "This is YOUTH BRIGADE?"

SOUL: "Yeah, umm, we went on tour and we came back, and we got a call from our friend who said Shawn Stern wants to talk to you guys. We said Shawn Stern, holy shit! What would he want to talk to us about? We had just sold out of Cd's and were broke, and we needed distribution, so we got the number, and I called him up and he's just, I heard about you guys from a bunch of different people and I'd be interested if you would send some stuff. So we send him stuff, Cd's, 7"s, shirts, and a week later we get back and there is a message on the machine, 'Hey it's Shawn Stern, it's fuckin' awesome, I'd like to do something.' He wanted to sign us, but we just got a distribution/production deal for now on our CD now, and one more. He's a great guy."

SP: "I heard a rumor that you are going on a world tour, is that true?"

SOUL: "Well, Shawn Stern wants to send us to Europe. We might go with YOUTH BRIGADE, but Brian has to have knee surgery first, so depending when he gets surgery is depending when we go to Europe, and everything. We'll probably do another U.S. tour this summer, then record in California for a new record, but that is all up in the air."

SP: "How is recording for you guys, your live set is really high energy, It's tough to get the vocal sound that thick on a recording. Is it difficult to get what you want, or are you happy what you have so far?"

SOUL: "The last CD, is the first recording that we've done that we like, we've done a lot, and we've done everything wrong. It's not always the engineer, it's not always the studio, you have to be ready mentally, and the songs have to be ready. A lot of times we weren't ready that way."

SP: "This is the big question right now, especially for fanzines, the big punk rock interview question. Bands that have the sound that you have, such as FLOW, who have the DESCENDENTS style, do you feel any indifference by magazines like Maximum Rock and Roll, and their attitude, have you recieved any kind of attitude from them?"

SOUL: "Actually there's a funny story about MRR, Pete called up, this way back before we put out our new 7", and our CD, he called up to see if we could put an ad in, and the guy said 'Ok, I've heard of you guys, I have to listen to you guys, and check it out first.' What, we just want to put an ad in. So he said I'll call you back, so whatever. So he listens to the 7", and he called back, and said something like I don't think you are up to our standards for 1994, I don't know Pete talked to him, He wouldn't even let us put an ad in, I think MRR is cool at the same time, they are a great resource of information, but I really couldn't give a fuck what anybody thinks, they could say what they want, but the way we do it is fine, and were successful so I am not going to fucking cry if someone says some shit about us. Whatever."

SP: "You guys before you went to BYO you released your stuff on you own label, is that still around, and are you planning on putting out new releases?"

SOUL: "Yeah, we just put out a STICKS AND STONES 7", which is pretty rad, we might do a split with us, and a couple of other bands. It's just a matter of money right now Shawn is totally cool, he's willing to work with us, putting out stuff. Right now we are just concentrating on writing songs, and Brian's knee surgery. That's why we got distribution, because to do it yourself is really tiring, I'd spend all of my paycheck on the label. It was cool, but we couldn't do it the way we wanted to do it, and get it out to stores, we had letters from stores from all over the country. Kids calling from all over the country."

SP: "It's cool, it's great to have your own label. It's tough to do, it's tough to get that stuff out, but if you can do it, it's the best thing in the world."

SOUL: "It's the best, well it's the best way to get started. We tried every way, we tried getting signed, a couple years ago we sent all this stuff to record labels, and we got all the rejection letters, so we said 'Fuck it', and

as soon started to do it ourselves, it works better, and you see immediate results. Even if it's a couple of letters in the mail, it begins to grow."

SP: "What was it like touring for you guys, personally, do you have any horrible stories, was it really tough living in a van?"

SOUL: "We lived together for five years, so it has always been pretty cool, when I come home I feel out of place, I love sleeping on people's floors and shit, and being in a different town everyday. The only time it's tough, when you've driven all night, and you just played a show, and you're so exhausted. But then you get one night of sleep, you get a shower, and like...cool, I'm here. It's all you need, I'm home for a and I'm all ready to go back. I can see how some people don't like it, but we are not attached to home, I love being out and about."

SP: "You got this album out, it's going pretty well, you got a tour, your getting into a lot of cool stuff. If you got to write your own story, your own way, what would BOUNCING SOULS choose to do with your future?"

SOUL: "You can only speculate I guess, so I guess I'll speculate, but I know for sure, whatever you speculate never comes true. I guess put out records, our own way, and our own time, and do whatever we want to do. Do our own merchandising, we have our good friend Margie who books all of our tours, and make a living... you know. Keep everything the way we want, the prices fair, and make a living.. Pay my rent, not have to starve on the road."

SP: "Do you think you can do that on BYO, or do you think you are going to have to move father ahead to a bigger label, or go back on your own when you get the money, like YOUTH BRIGADE did?"

SOUL: "It's funny, you think you need a lot of money to do this, and we have talked to major labels, well they've talked to us, and they tried to convince us that they can do something that we can't. The way they look at it is we can get you into Sam Goody, and get you to play in front of 10,000 people. I wouldn't want to play in front of 10,000 people every night, we played big shows, and I like playing big shows, but I don't want to get to the point where you have to play big shows all the time. It's funny, when I talked to this guy Brian just said to him, 'What can you do for us?' Well, Mtv...and we were like..We don't want that. Were not good businessmen, we're really not, but we're learning. We sell a lot of shit, but we also spend a lot on the tour. With six people on the road, and gas, and food, it's hard. Driving six hours a day, with six people, for two months, that's like \$5,000 right there, and you got to make that just to be above water, so I'm glad we do it. We are still in debt a little right now, but it's alright. I'd rather be there, and keep things rolling, than nowhere, not moving."

SP: "Do you have any words you want to go out with?"

SOUL: "umm...Thanks Man."

SP: "Thank you."
