

Q: When and how did Ripping Corpse

SR: 7 months ago Shaune and I were in a band called The Beast and we wanted to do a side project that was thrash. Ripping Corpse was just a side project. Things happened and The Beast broke up and we became Ripping Corpse. It was a side project originally.

Q: What's your audience like?

SR: Thrashers but we're starting to get a bit of crossover because some of the stuff is real fast. Some of the lyrics are really hardcore in a way. Not alot of people realize that until they get a lyrics sheet. We're definately not a death metal band.

Q: How can we improve the NJHC scene?

SR: Help each other. Break down walls people put up. That's what "Conservative Zombie" is all about. People that have the point of view "I can't fit into that situation because it doesn't fit my rules."

SK: Have fun.

SR: What's music but entertainment?

Even if it has a political comment.

Q: What are your influences lyrically and musically?

SR: Lyrically Clive Barker is like God to me, H.P. Lovecraft and the




Q: Who came up with the lp cover?

A: That idea was formulated by ANON (alias L7) except we had to purposely super-impose the babie's head poorly because no one would let us use their child during the photo session.








HARD-ONS- lp (Big Time)

Chalk another one up for the Aussies who keep hitting our shores with rockin' stuff. Heavy Buzzcocks feel here, plus a raw melodic edge. Thank to Big Time, insted of buying all those 7" and such, you get it all on one album. G-reat.

BLAST!- It's in My Blood (SST)
Once again Blast! capture 'Flag's intensity and emotion, NOT in a copying sense, all on one slab. Clifford growls like a dog who got his bone taken away. Losing a guitarist has done nothing to their force. No clunkers and no nonsese.

PRONG- Primitive Origins (Mr. Bear)
Imagine Scornflakes meet Black
Sabbath. In other words, ex-Swans
form a metal band. Tempo changes
ahoy on this baby. Definitely an
album not to pass up, and an album
not full of tedious metal.

WARZONE- Lower East Side Crew (Revelation)

Energy with a capital "E". The grungy recording makes it even more powerful. The lyrics are "those" type of straight edge lyrics. Even though I heard they didn't do great opening up for the Ramones, so I guess their shows don't capture the intensity of this 7". (They SUCKED live- BC & ES).

SEPTEMBER VIOLENCE

At a recent show in Rutgers I caught up with John Terry and Kurt Lang and did a surprize interview with no warning. It's real long.

Q: SEPTEMBER VIOLENCE. What is it?

John Terry (JT): I fuckin' hate the name. If I had my way you wouldn't be printing in this issue here on this little page that says September Violence and probably has no pictures. Anyway, I'm John and I used to be in PED and I quit and I used to be in Et Cetera, too yeah, and that really sucked. Well at least what was recorded sucked but we did like two shows that were fuckin' awesome live. Then I was in PED for a real long time, you know, the guy with the real long hair that they just replaced with another guy with long hair and nobody noticed I quit and someone else took my place but they sounded real fuckin' on it tonight I have to say. After leaving the band, I have to say they really sounded on it. Stu was fuckin' great. He's fuckin' rollin' all over the place & shit. I don't know. Are you allowed to print this much profanity?

TZS: No problem. We had a Mentors interview awhile back.

JT: Anyway, VISION kicked out Dave Franklin. What else is new? And Garrett's singing, the little twerp. They need a bass player who is not going to be Kurt Lang who is our bass player. Just because he's straight now doesn't mean he can be in Vision. How does it go again? (John sings:)

For e. Come hold out x's high ing our song and give V-I-S-I-O-N-Vision service.

Ok, anyway, I'm totally straight now. I totally quit doing everything.

Kurt Lang (KL): You've got a beer in
your left hand...

JT: The problem is that I came to this show tonight and I got one beer and now I can't stop drinking. But I have straightend out totally. I'm not and obnoxious prick on stage anymore which actually really sucks. But I have a really positive attitude and I'm straight but I'm not a straight edge positive guy and here's Kurt Lang for the weather.

KL: I'm Kurt, I play bass, I like the name, I was never in PED, I've never even heard of Et Cetra, I have no news to report, John's drinking a beer so so much for his straight edge speil.

Q: What do you have out?

JT: Here's the deal and I'll make this short and simple and won' talk for a million and a half years. They got together, they had this guy John Sherman who named the band and my best friend 'til he moved Dave Rock and he was moving in August which is



already past now and they were going to record a demo. Dave played drums, Kurt on bass, Neil on vocals and Pete on guitar. John Sherman had split by then. They asked me to mix the demo for them and I was really into working in the studio then and I thought they were an ok band. But when I went into the studio without all the pa bullshit, people not looking like they were too into it or getting a good response on stage. In the studio they sounded really good. I asked them if they wanted another guitar player because I could get them a drummer. I know this drummer named Craig who said he'd do it if I'd do it too 'cause Dave Rock moved and they were looking for a new drummer. You can mix this up into more literate words if you want. got Craig to join the band and I'm the second guitar player now and like play leads where Pete didn't on the demo tape and they're kinda distributing the demo a little bit, but since we've got a new line up and it sounds better we're kinda taking it easy on the demo tapes. But if anyone wants them we'll give them to them. But in November, I think Thanksgiving day, we'Re recording on It's gonna sound fuckin' 16 tracks. excellent. It's gonna be alot better. That's what I have to say about demo tapes. And Kurt on the weather of demo tapes.

KL: I don't know. It rained on the last one. John pretty much said everything. I just hope this doesn't get printed word for word because this will take up about 30 pages.

Q: What's September Violence's sound like? Are you speed metal, thrash...

JT: It's kinda diverse. Before they were doing a cover of YMCA which was brilliant. It was great. Their was 12 vocals, 6 people overdubed twice. It sounded like a colleseum full of people and it kicked. We're not doing it live. It's weak live 'cause it doesn't have all those vocals. They've got some fast songs, songs that have fast parts and slow parts, typical shit, a couple of songs that sound metal. One of which we've dropped.



KL: The new stuff is more like the Replacements.

JT: Nah, I wouldn't say Replacements. Don't say that. No, cause their's no bar chords. BC: The first one was very limited. Only two hundred copys. The second one was just released today so that's why you haven't heard it. (and I continue to talk about TZS])






