

#### This time it's for real

The nationwide climate of anti-rock hysteria has begun to claim real victims

. This summer ex-Dead Kennedys vocalist/songwriter Jello Biafra and four others will be tried before a jury in Los Angeles on criminal charges stemming from a record album Each defendant faces up to a year in prison and a \$2,000 fine. The legal implications of this case are enormous, for music and art and free speech in general

The targeted album (Frankenchrist, by Dead Kennedys, Alternative Tentacles) included a poster of a painting by the renowned, Oscar-winning artist H. R. Giger

- · An 18-year-old record-store clerk in Callaway, Florida, is slapped with a felony charge for selling a rap music cassette to someone four years her junior. She faces up to five years in prison. The store has already shut its doors
- · In Goshen, Indiana, Marianne Hatfield is targeted by a local church group with death threats and attacks on her children, friends, and property because she publishes a music magazine, Rock Rag.
- . The FCC picks an alternative news station as its first target in a crackdown on "explicit language" in radio. It moves on to force New York's controversial Howard Stern Show out of national syndication.
- · New immigration laws are used to bar musicians, speakers, and journalists from entering or appearing in the United States.
- Rock music magazines from SPIN to Tiger Beat are removed from Wal-Mart and other convenience stores after a TV evangelist claims the magazines are "pornographic"

The Bialra/Frankenchrist trial will be the test case. The prosecution knows it. We know it. And we need your help.

Refusing to plea bargain, Bialra and the four co-defendants pleaded not quilty to the charges in Los Angeles. The costs of the upcoming trial will be very high.


Token Entry was on next and they played a lot of stuff off the new album, really good set. Justice League were on next but since I didn't know any of their stuff, it wasn't too memorable.

# ATTENTION ALL MUSIC LOVERS AND OTHER CONCERNED CITIZENS

Below is a petition to the FCC protesting their recent crackdown on "indecent" language. Please sign it and get as many people as possible from your radio station or company to do likewise. Detach at the line and send the original copy to:

We also recommend that you send copies to your representatives and senators. If you are a college radio station, a copy should also be sent to your university administration.

We, the undersigned, protest the recent FCC rulings regarding "indecent" language. We believe that individual stations are much better equipped to judge community standards and interests than a federal commission. As we celebrate the 200th anniversary of the Constitution, we are firmly opposed to recent FCC actions which greatly limit our First Amendment rights. Under the new rulings, the range of music, public affairs programming, and artistic and literary presentations will be sharply curtailed., Justice Brennan's dissent in FCC v. Pacifica contains an apt description that applies to the recent rulings as well: "(This) may be seen for what, in the broader perspective, it really is: another of the dominant culture's invevitable efforts to force those groups who do not share its mores to conform to its ways of thinking, acting and speaking."

The vague, broad and overly restrictive rulings of the FCC pose a great threat to radio, alternative musicians, artists and labels and to the free discussion of important topics. We urge the FCC to cease this censorship and give broadcast media the same First Amendment protection accorded other media.
