band broke up for a while and reformed in
July '87 with a new guitarist and bassist.
The line up now is: E. McD., throat; Tom S.,
Drums; Pete Tabbot, Guitar; John Longo, Bass.

TWP .- Give your definition of HARDCORE.

C.F.- Hardcore is a group of people who stick together whether they are straight edge, bent edge, nazi, or whatever.

V/A - So This Is Newark


