Some great local bands have been emerging from Philadelphia and the surrounding area. Some of these bands are Tornado 6, Mad Anthony Wayne and the Magnetic Jesus, Dandelion, Ghenis Kahn Experience, Carnival of Shame, and Our Fading Smiles. As Local Band/ Music Director of WKDU, I do have my favorites and these bands, like all local bands, should be searched out and listened too.

Love Gutter, who are on Black Hole Records, have been playing in the club scene for over two years now and will soon be coming out with a new album. The album, titled "Sucking in the '90's", will include two outrages songs that will give you stomach cramps from the all too truthful lyrics . They are "A Date with Uncle Eddy" and "...and Ann B. Davis as Alice" also the titles themselves are self explanatory and is accompanied with some cool noise. Love Gutter's sound consists of hard hitting guitar and deep scratchy vocals. They are classic and disgusting like the their T-shirt design of the vomiting Rolling Stone logo.

Lead by a charismatic, sexy and heavily tattooed lead singer, 3 Foot Acid is a funky heavy metal band with ear catching songs that are worth remembering. Their cassette, "Biggest Hits" is being sold around Philly and they also have other merchandise like the first logo G-string. Paul Bearer, formally of the band The Serial Killers, has a distinctive voice that can not be mistaken or compared to other vocalists. With a strong bass sound, Paul's voice makes a big impact on my favorite song from the album, "Nutcracker". This song can make the prudent person quiver with ecstasy and that is good enough for me to love this band.

Another band that is making a good name for themselves and for Philadelphia is Amazing Thrill Show. This band has been mentioned in several different publications like East Coast Rocker and City Paper and have performed at many local clubs and colleges. The Amazing Thrill Show have been interviewed on several local radio stations including my show on WKDU. The band has two demo tapes and will soon be releasing a two song 7-inch record that will be available to

their listeners. This trio has a worked some well known producers and for their new 7-inch, is no different with the help of Steve Garby from the Buzzcocks. One song that are worth mentioning from their second demo is "No Questions Asked" which has a great tune to it that you can't help to swing too. Look out for this band and it would be worth it, when the opportunity is there, to see Amazing Thrill Show.

Liquid Lynn has performed and have been interviewed on several different shows just on 'KDU alone. Performing soon in Delaware and at The Barbary and 40th St. Underground. Liquid Lynn have been around for about two years in one form or another and is made up of members from several separate bands. The style of this band has such a variety that one song played is a country tune then they can perform a hard rock song. The bass player (Rob DiJoseph) and their guitar player (Keith Carroll) switch on some songs and this adds more to its musical variety.

Last but not least, another great band that is around is Tubal Cain, that consists of four members of Executive Slacks. Tubal Cain developed its own original sound in the late '80's

that is described by one member as a Heavy Metal approach to Disco. A three song EP is out as a sampler for there forth coming album titled "25 Assorted Needles". This future LP will be distributed by Caroline Records under the Verdigo label. It would be cool if you can catch

If you can't afford to take care of one kid, how can you afford to take care of eight?



Gena- Wait, who is Tony Bennet? Becky- (singing) "I left my heart in San Fransisco...", oh sorry, this thing is on.





Becky- I never really think about it actually. Theo- It is such a mixed crowd really, we have the older alternative type people, we have skinheads, little punkers, you know everybody...metalheads.

I noticed that at the Continental your took time out to mention the rally against fake abortion clinics, and now you are at Rock For Choice, do you always make it a point of bringing up these issues? Theo- We say something about pro-choice at just about every show, if not every show.

Becky-This is our third Rock For Choice. Theo- And we will continue to do them as long as we are invited to, because it is a very important issue

Becky- It is a good chance for all those kids to see the literature out front and to sign up, where as they normally wouldn't come into contact with people who would pass it on to them.

Theo-Totally, and I think it is great that these things are all ages, because these kids need to get educated early. They have to know whats at stake and what can be taken away from them before they're even thinking about it, before they're even worried about it, you know what I mean?....Before they get pregnant, or before their girlfriends get pregnant. Are there any other issues you think

are central to the philosophy of the band, is there one..or as individuals?

Theo- We all have our own things, some of us are vegetarians and are very adamant about that, some of us...well, we all believe that pot should be legalized...what other issues? Becky-I am homosexual, so I am interested in gay rights.

Theo-Yeah, we're down for gay rights, AIDS research, free speech...everything, anti racism, anti homophobia...

The word 'feminist' holds a lot of negative baggage, even after what, twenty five years? Have you felt the repercussions of that? I know you are probably slammed for being feminist, militant females, you know crazy ideas etc., Do you hear that?

Gena- We have never actually been called militant feminists

—Theo I wish we would

Gena- A lot of people an afraid to call themselves feminists, which I think is ridiculous, because anyone who thinks oppression is wrong is a eminist, and that word has almost become taboo, you know? I think it is ridiculous, and I hope it is starting to change.

Do you think the way you express yourselves on stage and through your music has a

direct correlation to your attitudes toward feminism and womans rights?

Gena-Sure, definitely, just the fact that we are up there is a way in itself. This is what we want to do, I want other people to see women up on stage, I like to see women on stage. I listen to rock and roll and it is nice to see womens bands instead of constantly seeing male bands and trying to ignore their lyrics. Theo- Yeah, there are so many bands

that I like but when I sit and listen to their lyrics, it just hits me. I was just talking about this with a friend of mine the other day, about how everything in the media, music, movies, books...not EVERYTHING of those things, but just about every movie I see I like a lot BUT there is something really sexist about it OR there is something really racist about it, and it is the same with so many bands, every heavy metal video has got some woman in it selling their music.

Becky- Well I have gotta go, bye So does this attitude and this awareness permeate all your lyrics or do you keep it separate? Theo-Some have it some are just

Gena-For the most part our image is more ridiculous, about comedy and silly things...you know, that's what we do, what most of our lyrics are about,

Do you think that is one of the reasons people give you such slack, it perpetuates the dumb female myth?


Gena-That does? no, I think that in way it brings us a lot of respect because I can't think of any other bands that play up the comedy that are female, there are a lot of joking bands that are male. I think people appreciate the fact that we have a good sense of humour and that we like to joke about disgusting things, bodily excretions,

a lot of things women are not supposed to talk about or like, or be fascinated with.

What is your opinion of organized religion and its influence on the abortion issue?

Gena- I think organized religion ...I have a big problem with it, I don't like it at all, it The fanatical way they go about their anti-choice antics is scary...its scary...its horrible. They were just in NYC..

Theo-I know, but like, when I was younger I could barely...I tried to ask my mother to take me to the gynecologist and she just would not hear of it, and my mom is really cool and she is pro-choice and everything but I was just like,"mom..."



J: The rough trade story... everybody has a rough trade story. So your signed to Caroline now? How did you get that deal? Did they see you live or did they just like your singles?

F: I sent some tapes out a while ago and didn't hear anything from anybody really. When CM did a little review on us that got a bunch of major labels starting to gain interest. None of them ever called us back though. Brian Long from Rockpool got us a gig at CB's and he's since moved over to Caroline.

**J:** Ahh. So that's where the connection is. So what kind of stuff were you into when playing in the band during it's onset?

F: I was into early Sarah stuff a lot and Creation stuff.

J: So what do you like.

F(Steve): Well, my main influences are like Black Sabbath and Pink Floyd.

**J:** Ok, So I guess we have a Black Sabbath/Sea Urchins mix here.



### Billy Childish - Original Chatham Jack


Billy goes Cajun on this one with a bluesy album which sounds a little different than most of his stuff.
