




House Bill 2982 • Censorship in Progress




CYCLISTS ARE CAR SICK!

One area where Guy'ner surpasses Mazy Star is their amazingly natural vocal interaction so prevalent in songs like "Making Headlines". Their first full length release was supposed to be entitled "hard for MAZY for you" but was subsequently changed due to external pressures from Capitol records. When Guy'ners not busy having Blonde Redhead open for them on their national tour, their hard at work on a sound track for Madonnas new feature film, "The Inner Search For Chui Chui Fen Fen". Glendale Matchbox Martyr/Brown Recluse 7"


















Chavez -"Repeat the Ending/Hack the sides away"

After wading through all the bands that spend more time worrying about sound effects than chords listen to this 7" and remember that there are some bands that don't go crazy when recording.

This is the newest release from a Japanese band that is often referred to as a Boredoms side project, and it does indeed feature Yamamoto from the Boredoms. As the title implies this contains live and prerecorded material from 87 to 93; plus 5 new tunes. Watch the levels when listening to this record, and you will find pure craziness. Right and Left channels are often on different pages throughout the new recordings. This is much more wacked out than Black Hawaii. Some of the passages on this record are minimalistic, while others are complex and confusing, and sometimes Omoide Hatoba just sounds like a broken Nintendo machine. My one complaint is that this collage is all contained on one track. This makes for quite a pain in the ass, if you want to focus on a particular song.

The percussion beats in an enveloping rhythm and the noises seem to run amuck, yet completely flt. This 7" is another fine piece of Crash Worship captured on vinyl. Even if you are not completely drawn in by this record, i would suggest you NOT miss seeing one of their legendary live performances.



Two bass players drive slughog's low end while the guitar keeps the songs dynamic. As with all Slughog that i have heard, these songs have that loud and driving rhythm that pushes the limits of noiserock. Listen to this with maximum volume and stomp something.
