


What follows is a an exerp from a Dash Rip Rock interview I conducted when they were in town for one of their 1990 Philly shows. The three piece "power trio" from New Orleans is always well received for their fast-paced cowpunk tunes and crazy stage antics.

KDU- One thing I like about you guys is that when you do a live show it seems like you have a lot of fun with the audience --- a drunk will call out, play a Merle Haggard song, and you'll go right into it.

DASH - Its a funny thing about us and the audience. We generally like to get them involved in some way. Sometimes we won't write a playlist, we just let the audience call out songs and we'll launch right into them when they say'em. It's a more hands-on kinda thing. Even if they holler out really horrible songs, like by STYX or Warrant or Queensrych we try to play them too and we butcher them up pretty good.

KDU - Yeah, you always have the wise guy that says, Play "Stairway to Heaven" or "Freebird. And you guys do "Stairway to Freebird," a combination of the two.

DASH - It comes from playing so many fraternity parties in the deep south, because those frat guys really have out of this world requests. We try to make fun of people when they yell out song we obviously can't do, since we're a "power trio". --- It makes the audince feel as if their being one with the band and they go home thinking what nice guys they are. --- Being one with the band, isn't that like copulating with the band?

KDU - The first time I heard about you guys, I was at a Mojo Nixon show. And along with his rantings and ravings, one of the things he said was that you guys should listen to more Dash Rip Rock, The Replacements, The Beat Farmers.

DASH - It funny you should mention Mojo now. Bill is going off to Memphis to play on Mojo's solo album. --- I'll be the guitar picker, John Doe from X is playing bass, and Country Dick from the Beat Farmers is playing the drums. It'll be called Mo-Doe-Dick-Dash. Mojo's been wanting to do a band for a long time and now he's finally got the chance. (Actually the album is called "Otis." It just came out and is another fine piece of Mojomania with soon-to-be classics such as "Don Henley Must Die" and "Put a Sex Mo-Sheen in the White House.")

KDU - So, your new record gonna be out soon, supposedly? (Although the record has now been out for some time, there was originally a delay due to one of the song titles. "Bum Fuck Egypt", incidently my personal fave song on the record, had to be changed to Bum for Egypt on the record cover so that K-Mart and all the other hip department stores would carry the record.)

DASH - Funny you should say supposedly. It called "Not of This World." The first two were kinda good and rockin, kinda rockabilly, this ones kinda venturing into crazy garage rock, more like our live show. It was produced by Jim Dickinson (Replacements, Mojo, Scruffy the Cat). He's a real wild producer, made us go really wild in the studio. --- Like he had a cattle prod. We'd be all drunk and passed out and he'd come in and say TIME TO PLAY XX XX.

KDU - So this tour you're doing gigs with Evan Johns?

DASH- Yeah, he's doing about 10 or 11 dates with us. He just called up and he just wanted to get in his van and just drive around and do dates. He comes up and plays a couple songs with us because I'm a big fan of his and we pretty much know his material. I met him when he was with the Leroi Brothers and we're doing a cover of theirs of on "No of this world" (I Don't Wanna Stop).

DASH - We got a letter from Donna Douglas who portrayed Ellie May on the "Beverly Hillbillies." She does christian benefits now, but I think she would be in our video if we paid her a whole lotta money.

PSYCHIC TV

Psychic TV traveled through Philadelphia this summer during their tour. Genesis and Paula P-Orridge stopped by WKDU for an interview. Psychic TV's latest album "Towards Thee Infinite Beat" on Wax Trax Records is their first true domestic release. Also released this summer was a double 12" single "Beyond Thee Infinite Beat," featuring DJ remixes of the LP.

One of the accomplishments of the group has been to establish the TEMPLE OV PSYCHICK YOUTH Network. "We decided we should try to build a simple but inclusive philosophy or sketches of ideas, ways to live, how to contact people, how to change behavior, the mind, anything that moves people toward being humane beings as opposed to clever animals," explains Genesis. "It seemed that if you're going to be in a band, you're going to try to talk about ideas. Ultimately your perception of how to live. If that's what you're putting into the music when you play live, and people get excited by it or feel an empathy with it. It's ridiculous to walk away and leave them suspended in midair with no backup."

The TEMPLE OV PSYCHICK YOUTH Network now has headquarters in Scandinavia, Britain, North America, Germany, Italy, and Greece. The Network has been getting many calls from Poland, Hungary, and Yugoslavia since the Berlin Wall came down. Genesis says that they will probably be doing a lecture / installation type tour of Eastern Europe to find out what the people would like to build there.

The emphasis of the Network has changed from being intellectual to being practical. "The next inevitable phase is to find ways to interact and form some kind of community," says Genesis. His aim is to build a collective community which will not try to escape this society but will

be a place to go to work harder. The community would attract not just by the nature of the work it got done. It would also try to counteract the propaganda that we don't go along with that we get from this society.

Keep looking for the utopian community that Psychic TV is going to establish. It will be the perfect place for all of us who know they don't fit in to get to know people who feel the same.

BUZZCOCKS

The Buzzcocks were one of the most influential bands of the "Punk Rock Movement" of the 1970s. Their style was one of the most unique, if not the most interesting of the era. Pete Shelly (vocals and guitar), John Maher (drums), Steve Diggle (lead guitar), and Steve Garvey (bass) played loud, fast, stripped down pop songs. With no big media blitz, the original Buzzcocks reunited for a short American tour. On November 11th, they played to Philadelphia, with a set that included "Promises," "Pulse Beat," "What Do You Know," and others.

WKDU had the opportunity to briefly speak with Pete Shelley after the show and ask him a few questions.

WKDU: What gave you the idea the reunite the band and start touring again?

Pete Shelly: It all started as rumors really - rumors that the band was already back together and playing and people picked up on these rumors and started inquiring about whether or not they could actually get us to play over here in the states. There were a couple of tour proposals that came through. Then I met up with our old manager at the New Music Seminar and he asked if we were back together. I said no, but we were interested in the offers. A few weeks went by and he came back with a proposal. We phoned everyone and asked "Do you fancy doing this? It's only for 3 or 4 weeks." And everyone said yes.

WKDU: Was is difficult to get everyone back together? Had you kept in contact since the breakup? PS: No more in contact that you'd be with very old friends, see them once in a blue moon...

WKDU: Did it take a lot of practicing to relearn the old songs?

PS: Not really, we managed to get it down in 3 or 4 days...

WKDU: There was no media blitz about this reunion. Why?

PS: Since this whole thing came together only 2 months ago, there was no time to set up a complete media extravaganza. It's kind of by word of mouth.

WKDU: Is this a one shot deal, this tour? Are you planning to do an album?

PS: It started that we would just be together for an American tour, but since people have found out, we're going to do a British tour and maybe a European tour, Japan, Australia,....a world tour...

WKDU: What do you think about other bands covering your songs?

PS: It doesn't offend me. A lot of people think it offends me, but to me, it's good that it reached a wider and different audience that we managed the first time around.

(Stan K. and Anita had the pleasure of interviewing Pete Shelley.)

w-wkdu, k-kim gordon, t-thurston moore

w-are you getting -alot of pressure now that you're on a major?Do you worry about diehards accusing you of selling out?

t-Yea well I guess we are selling out, laughs no we don't feel any pressure from our label.we wouldn't have signed with one if we couldn't do what we wanted, you know, we have total artistic control

k- I think they were really bummed when they saw the cover of our new LP, for one thing it was black and white

t-the cover is a Raymond Pettibon drawing,he used to do black flag and minutemen covers, and we always wanted to use him they thought it looked like a bootleg. which it does. which is fine. they just couldn't deal with it k-and then it has the line" we killed our parents" and they wanted us to make another cover to put out but we just said forget it

t- we told them to screw off ,whatever, they can't sell it in woolworth's. so what. i mean it's not our ambition to sell a million records for a major label.

w- How did you hook up with Chuck D?

t- they were doing Fear of a Black Planet in the same studio that we were doing Goo. We were just hanging out and watching TV with them

K-thurston kept sending me out to the lobby to to ask them to sign our CD from their last record. he had somehow built up this fantasy that Chuck liked me T- well he respected you because you had these good conversations with him I mean was just like this 7 foot jerk

I was like the flavor of the band , Kim was like the Chuck

Discussion of upcoming tour plans for August which by this time have already come and gone Except for October when they will tour the whole US w-The new record...

k- I think the songs are really good t-we did it with really too much of a 24 track overkill kind of situation, which was more of a learning experience for us. we worked with 24 before but thistime we had more money, more time

k- some things sound better but inevitably you end up with the same problems

t-there's spontaneity missing though. we did demos before that on a little 8 track in this dump on 14th St. they were real swinging sounding, real spontaneous. you sorta lose that somewhat, you start getting into the whitesnake sound

w-Do you prefer a smaller crowd,

t-yea, like city gardens is really ideal in a way k- I mean they could use slightly bigger PA

t- yea they could beef up the sound a little, so you don't have to struggle so much to make it sound good

harder to get it across at a bigger place unless it has exceptional acoustics, which is so rare w-we saw you at the Ritz with Mudhoney and the Hyenas. it was real hot inside

k-that was really uncomfortable

there.it's

t-yea real hot, they weren't letting people in, t- that was a bad experience, we just said no we're not gonna play here again. the place was really new when we played there where do you play in nyc now, there's all these places on 42nd street that people are playing w-is Harry Crews a one-off thing?

k-yea basically, i wish we could have played in the us but there just wasn't any time. i got to meet harry crews, i interviewed him for some cable show, that was really amazing,

w-are any of the songs his lyrics?

k-there just sort of roughly inspired by his books. he's just a writer that lydia and i both like.

w-looking back now do you think you had any actual plans or goals when you first started out?
k-it was always day to day, we'd been together for like two months when someone said "oh you wanna put a record out?"
